What will it be like in Year 1?

To ensure a successful transition into Year I, our curriculum and teaching changes throughout the year, to best suit the needs of the children.

At the beginning of the Year, although working from the National Curriculum, Year I will be play-based, just like Reception. The children will spend time playing, completing adult-directed tasks at tables, and just like in Reception, the children will have carpet sessions too.

As we move through the year, although we will still complete playful activities to help us learn, the learning becomes more 'formal:' the children will have lessons that consist of carpet time, and table time.

Our day in Year I will be made up of lessons, each one linked to a different subject area. This is similar to EYFS, although is a more formal way of working.

Throughout the Year, the children will learn knowledge and skills in different subject areas: science, history, geography, art, design and technology, in addition to maths, English, PSHE and music, which were taught throughout EYFS. Each of these subject areas were explored throughout EYFS as part of the curriculum.

Reading

Children's book bags need to be sent into school EVERYDAY.


We will provide a book for you to read with your child at home which will be changed weekly.

We urge you to read every night with your child.

Just for five regularly can make a massive difference. Children are expected to have read their book at home a few times before we can change it in school.

We can only change books if they are brought in so please don't forget your book.

In addition to reading at home, we will listen to your child read in class as often as we can.



Phonics



You may already know that all YI children, nationwide, will complete a statutory phonics check towards the end of the year.

The phonics check tests the children's ability to recognise sounds and read words, both real and nonsense.

It is so important that you're reading at home so that the children will learn more and remember more.

We will inform you with dates and expectations nearer the time. Don't worry, we'll be well prepared!

Homework expectations

Children will receive homework every week. This homework is slightly different to the home learning activities you were set in EYFS.

The homework will be a range of maths, handwriting, phonics, writing and other curriculum activities. Don't worry, we won't give you this all at once!

Homework will be given out each Friday. We appreciate your help with homework and understand this amount can be overwhelming at first but this is a way to become actively involved in your child's learning and help your child meet the high standards expected.

All homework is expected to be returned.

Handwriting

In Year One, we teaching a new style of handwriting. It looks like this...

abc

We start all letters from the line; this makes it easier for children to form and join letters correctly and, research has shown, can help children with their spellings due to the flow of this style of writing. We call our style of writing 'lead-in' lines.

This is not something that the children will be expected to do right away, but is something they will begin to learn to do throughout the year.



Snacks

We provide the children with the option of a healthy snack. There is milk or water for them to drink, and a piece of fruit to eat.

Please do not send a snack into school with your children.

Please remember we are a nut-free school!



<u>Water</u>

We provide the children with a school water bottle. The children will be able to access these bottles throughout the day.

Please do not send a water bottle from home into school.
