Of course, with so much happening, our newsletter this week is absolutely packed with opportunities for our children. Opportunities is one of our key Crown Curriculum drivers and this week it has been jammed packed! These opportunities matter because they help our children develop in so many different ways – not just academically, but socially and emotionally too.

I do want to take a moment to celebrate our Year Six children. They're preparing for their SATs at the moment and the work ethic and dedication they're showing is really impressive. It's not easy juggling the pressure of exams alongside everything else that's going on in their lives, but they're getting their heads down and getting on with it. The resilience they're displaying is something special, and we're right behind them every step of the way.

Thank you to Freddie in year one for a great song choice for our Feel Good Friday this morning. It was lovely to add a little bit of music to our morning greetings. I wonder who will get to choose the song next week?

On a slightly different note, I wanted to raise something with you that's been on our radar. We've been monitoring the use of mobile phones in school and we're noticing an impact that we need to address together. Issues around phones are starting to spill over into school, interrupting children's learning and, more importantly, affecting their emotional wellbeing. It's something that's been concerning us and we think it's important you're aware of what we're seeing.

Mobile phones and social media can be brilliant tools but when they're becoming a source of stress or distraction for some of our children, we need to think carefully about how we're managing them. We're keen to work with you on this because it's not something we can tackle alone. Whether it's about screen time at home, what children are accessing, or how they're using phones socially, it all feeds into what we see during the school day.

I'll be sharing more specific information about how we're going to move forward with this, but for now, I'd just ask that you keep an eye on things at home and perhaps have a chat with your child about their phone use. We're all in this together, and I'm confident that by working as a community, we can make a real difference.

Year 2 Rugby at Ruskin

Last week, our Year 2 and some year 4 pupils enjoyed an exciting visit to Ruskin Drive for a rugby festival hosted by Saints. The children had a fantastic time taking part in a range of

activities, showing great enthusiasm, teamwork, and sportsmanship throughout. It was wonderful to see everyone getting involved, building confidence, and having fun while learning new skills!



Y5 - Ancient Maya Civilisation

Year 5 had a fantastic morning experiencing life in the Ancient Maya civilisation.

Penalty Notice Fines for School are changing

These changes came into force from 19th August 2024

- 1st Offence**
The first time a penalty notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance it will be: **£160 per adult, per child (paid with 28 days)** Reduced to **£80 per adult per child** if paid in 21 days.
- 2nd Offence (within three years)**
The second penalty notice issued for term time leave or irregular attendance it will be: **£160 per adult per child, paid within 28 days.** There will be no reduced rate offered
- 3rd Offence and any further offences in three years**
The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a penalty notice will not be issued. The case will be presented to the Magistrates Court. Magistrates fines can be up to **£2500 per parent, per child.** Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate due to failing to safeguard a child's education

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence within a 10-week period
