A message from Miss Whittingham: the weather has certainly turned a lot colder this week. Luckily, the new boilers were installed and working just in time for the start of the cold snap! I attended a Northwich Education Partnership (NEP) meeting on Tuesday morning; we discussed some of the upcoming events for the children to take part in. Yesterday, My School Improvement Partner (SIP) visited for our first termly meeting. We had lots to discuss. He was very impressed with the behaviour of the children - including their learning behaviours. I was, as always very proud.

Year 5/6 have enjoyed being able to take their brass instruments home and developing their musical skills this week. In Year 3/4 we have completed our Stone Age to Iron Age unit. The children have all remembered the key information. KS1 and EYFS have been working hard to learn the songs for the Nativity - they sound lovely!

Head Lice and nits: we have unfortunately had some reports of head lice in school again. Please check your children's hair regularly. Please be aware that there is no need to buy expensive shampoos to get rid of any infestation. Using conditioner and combing through your child's hair, at least weekly, with a nit comb will effectively remove the lice and eggs (nits). Reading: please continue to encourage your child to read at home. Every Monday morning, children's reading diaries are taken in. If a child has read 3 or 4 times in the week, they get 1 spot on their chart. If they have read 5 times or more, they get 2 spots. Once they reach 20 spots, they will receive a certificate in our Friday Celebration Assembly. Reading regularly - or being read to - very much supports children with developing their understanding, confidence, reading fluency and writing. Well done to the children receiving their Bronze awards today.
