It's been another busy week in EYFS.

The children have been learning about the polar regions. They have been finding out which animals live there and discovering fun facts about these cold, unique environments. This helps children build their curiosity about the world and understand how animals and people adapt to different habitats.

In Maths, the children have been sorting and matching Numicon shapes. They compared sizes and shapes and counted the holes to check they had matched each shape correctly. Using Numicon helps children develop early number recognition, counting skills, and a secure understanding of number through hands-on, visual learning.



Next week, the children will take part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch. They will look out for different birds in our woodland area and talk about what they see. This is a fun way to explore nature and learn about caring for wildlife.
