tertiary industry	an industry that provides services rather than producing goods.
supply	an amount of something that is available for use.
commercial	related to making money by buying and selling things.
scale	The size of something.
wholesaler	someone who buys and sells goods in large amounts to shops and businesses.
interconnected	different parts or things connected to each other.
subsistence farming	farming that provides enough food for the farmer and their family to live on but not enough to sell.
demand	a need for something to be sold or supplied.
transnational companies	extending or operating across national boundaries.

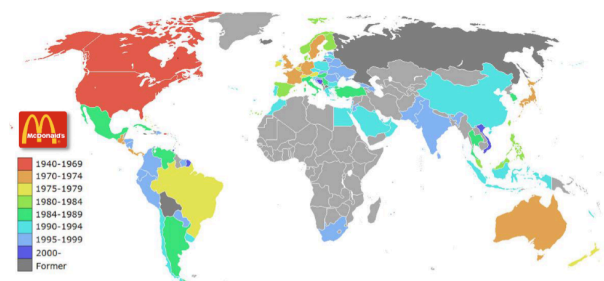

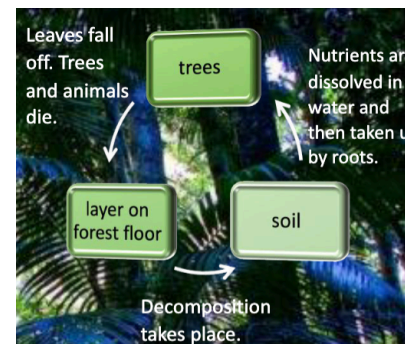

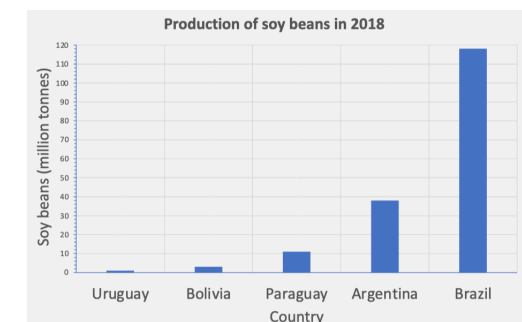
