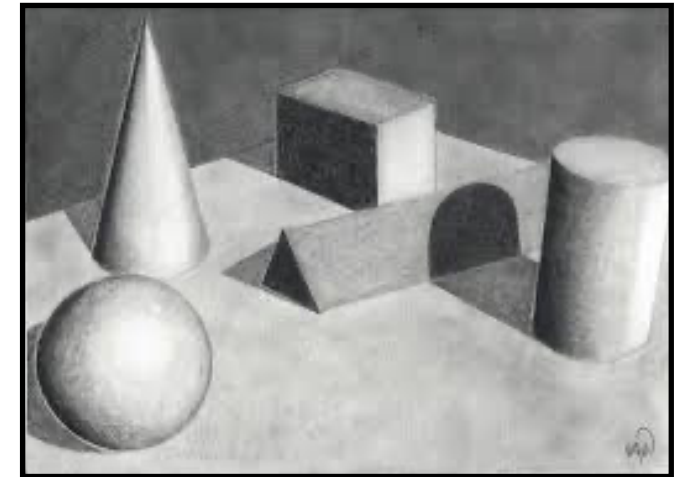
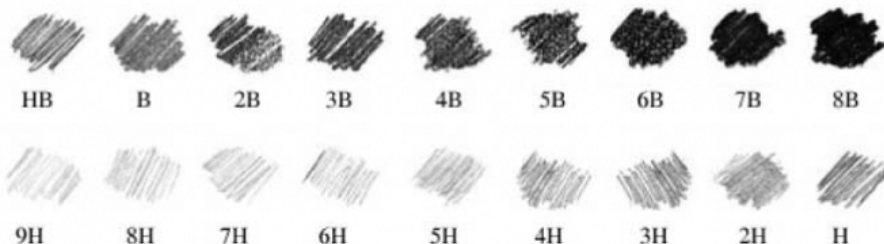


Vocabulary

line	a mark in art - can vary in width, direction and length, can be straight or curved
shape	The colours, textures or tones used in artwork to help recreate another shape - using circles, triangles and squares
colour	elements consisting of hues, chroma and value - we see colour when light strikes an object
texture	how something feels or looks on paper
tone	Chiaroscuro - how light or dark the drawing is
form	making a drawn object seem three-dimensional (3D) by using shading effectively
enlarging	to make bigger
media	(or medium) is the different materials used to make an artwork, such as pencil, graphite, oil, paint
portrait	an artwork that depicts the image of a particular person
portraiture	the style of artwork that depicts people or animals (see above)



Graphite scale - B (black, soft), H (hard)



A colour wheel showing the different hues, tints, tones and shades.

Remember the three primary colours are red, yellow and blue and we lighten and darken colours using black and white.
