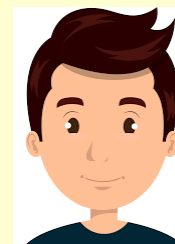
Key Vocabulary

Gender	The sex of a person or animal.
Stereotypes	An inaccurate view held in common by many people.
Opinion	What one thinks about something or somebody; viewpoint.
Responsibility	The condition or fact of being responsible.
Argue	To give reasons for or against something.
Court	A place where legal cases are heard.
Attitude	A way of feeling or thinking about something or someone.
Belief	A strong opinion.
Prosecute	To begin or carry on a court action against in order to enforce the law.
Defendant	One who is accused in a court of law.
Gender stereotyping	Gender roles are generally neither positive nor negative, they are simply inaccurate statements of the male and female attributes. Each person has individual desires, thoughts, and feelings, regardless of their gender.

Gender Stereotyping
