## Vocabulary – definitions and synonyms

synonyms are words with the same meaning (or almost the same meaning)

feast	a large, special meal (dinner, banquet)
knobbly	full of lumps (knotty, lumpy)
poisonous	likely to harm you and make you ill (toxic, venomous)
terrible	makes you afraid (fearful, frightening, dreadful, nasty, horrible)
scrambled	to mix together quickly (jumble, muddle)
astounding	surprising (amazing, astonishing)
