	Character- A person or an animal in a story.		Setting- Where the story takes place.
	Problem- There is another character or a situation that is a problem for the main character.		How the characters manage to sort out the problem and have a happy ending.

Phrases and repeated refrains from story text	
<i>Children will become very familiar with these phrases and use them in the oral retelling of the story</i>	
Once there was a boy	washed up
a star of his very own	bright, golden sand
He waited and he waited	the prettiest star
out of reach	And that's the end of the story

Vocabulary – definitions and synonyms <i>synonyms are words with the same meaning (or almost the same meaning)</i>	
sunrise	The moment each day when the sun can first be seen above the horizon and the colours of the sky and clouds change ( <i>light, dawn</i> )
grab	To take hold of something quickly ( <i>grasp, seize, snatch</i> )
lasso	A long rope with a sliding loop at the end for catching animals. ( <i>lariat</i> )
lifebelt	A ring or belt that fastens around your waist to help you float ( <i>preserver, buoy, float</i> )
floating	To rest on the top of water without sinking
jetty	A wooden platform built out into water ( <i>dock, pier, quay</i> )
