

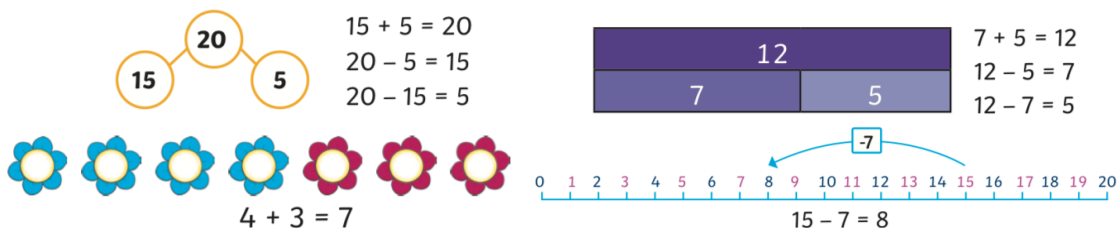


## Addition and Subtraction Year 2

### Key vocabulary

Add	To bring two or more numbers (or things) together to make a new total.
Total	The result of adding.
Subtract	To take one number away from another.
Greater Than	Bigger.  The symbol $>$ means greater than
Less than	Smaller.  The symbol $<$ means less than
Fact Families	A fact family is a group of math facts using the same numbers. For addition/subtraction, you use three numbers and get four facts. Eg: 10, 2, and 12: $10 + 2 = 12$ , $2 + 10 = 12$ $12 - 10 = 2$ $12 - 2 = 10$

### Part Whole Model



### Greater/Less than or Equal to

We use the symbols  $>$ ,  $<$  and  $=$  to compare the values of number sentences.

(10)  $6 + 4 < 6 + 5$  (11)  
 (10)  $6 + 4 > 3 + 6$  (9)  
 (7)  $11 - 4 = 12 - 5$  (7)  
 (7)  $11 - 4 < 12 - 4$  (8)

$>$  means Greater than

$<$  means Less than

$=$  means Equal to

$$5 + 3 = 8$$



$$4 + 4 = 8$$



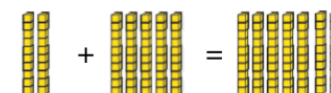
Therefore  $5 + 3 = 4 + 4$

### Related Facts

If I know that  $2 + 5 = 7$



I can use this fact to know that  $20 + 50 = 70$

$$\begin{array}{r} \text{T} \quad \text{O} \\ 5 \quad 6 \\ - 3 \quad 0 \\ \hline 2 \quad 6 \end{array}$$
