| Jesus and the Children (Mark 10:13-16) | In Jesus' time children were not thought of with any high regard. So when people brought their children to be blessed by Jesus several adults tried to stop them. However, Jesus told them to let the children come to him. |
| The Ten Lepers (Luke 17:11-19) | Leprosy was an awful, contagious disease with no cure. Jesus healed ten lepers when no one else would help them, but only one returned to thank him. |
| Blind Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52) | There was a man named Bartimaeus who begged on the streets of Jericho. When Jesus visited Jericho with his disciples, he came across Bartimaeus and healed his blindness. |
| The Man Lowered Through the Roof (Luke 5:17-26) | When people heard Jesus was in town, they would gather in crowds to meet and hear him speak. A paralysed man wanted to be cured, his friends lowered him through the roof to meet Jesus and cure him of his illness. |
