
Vocabulary using lines and outlines linear to place the same print on top on the original overlay a printing technique where the printing block has ink applied to its relief surface but not its recessed (indented) area - it is then brought to paper to show the design a printing technique where printmakers incorporate multiple layers reduction of colour in to a relief print (using lino, polystyrene or wood) marks or decorations cut into the surface incisions put upside down or in the opposite position, order or arrangement inverted to create an artwork based on the work of others. response add notes that give explantation or meaning to an artwork annotated

These are examples of reduction printing - after you have printed the first colour, you 'reduce' (or cut away at) the block print and print over the first print (overlaying).

Using this technique, your prints can have as many colours as you want!
