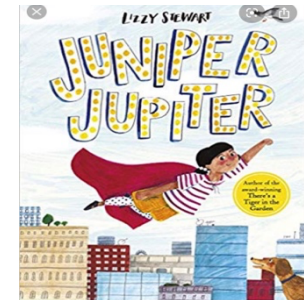




Reception: Juniper Jupiter Part A



Grammar	
Finger spaces	separation of words with spaces
Personal pronoun	defines a person or thing: I, you, he, she
Time adverbials	a word used to express time: first, next, finally, eventually, suddenly
Repeated story language	repeats the same words or phrases a few times to make an idea clearer and more memorable e.g. she ran and she ran and she ran
Adjectives	Describing words e.g. brave, smart, strong, fast

Write a sentence for each section of their story 4. Write two sentences for each section of their story 5. Write their own version of the story

Children will become very familiar with these phrases and use them in the oral retelling of the story, reading and writing	
Hilariously funny	Absolutely love
Right under her nose	Dynamic duo

Vocabulary – definitions and synonyms	
synonyms are words with the same meaning (or almost the same meaning)	
Real life	Things that happen everyday True, world, actual
Superhero	A person who has magical powers Magic, strong, hero, rescuer
loyal	Someone you can trust True, devoted, trustworthy
supersonic	Something that is super fast Quickly, hurried, racing
awesome	Something that is really good Fantastic, good, super
suddenly	Something that happens fast Instantly, at once, all of a sudden, swiftly
unfortunately	When someone is telling bad news Sadly, unhappily, sad to say
amazingly	Something that is surprising Stunning, shocking, incredible
