





Key vocabulary

mega city	A city with over 10 million inhabitants.
natural disasters	Natural event such as a flood, <u>earthquake</u> , or hurricane that causes great damage or loss of life
sustain	undergo or suffer something
populous	having a large population; densely populated.
makeshift	something used for a short time or in place of the usual thing
favelas	a Brazilian <u>shack</u> or <u>shanty town</u> ; a <u>slum</u> .
favelado	Someone that lives in a favela
stereotypes	an idea or belief many people have about someone that may not be true
portrayed	To make someone out to be a certain way
outskirts	the parts of a town or city that are furthest from the centre

In 1950, New York's population reached 10 million. A city with over 10 million inhabitants is called a megacity


Lima, the capital of Peru, is a mega city.
