Vocabulary – definitions and synonyms	
<i>synonyms are words with the same meaning (or almost the same meaning)</i>	
spy	when you find out secret information (notice, observe, spot)
cupboard	piece of furniture for storing things with a door and shelves (cabinet, closet)
cellar	a room below ground level in a house, used for storing (basement, below stairs)
ditch	a narrow channel dug to hold / carry away water (canal, gutter, moat)
hunt	to search for and catch other animals for food (follow, chase)
wicked	when something is morally wrong (evil, nasty, bad)
