






















Year 1 - Animal Groups

Biology

Key vocabulary	
amphibian	Amphibians live in water as a baby and on land as they grow older. They have smooth slimy skin.
bird	All birds have beaks, two legs, feathers and wings.
fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.
mammal	Mammals breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mothers milk as a baby. Humans are mammals.
reptile	All reptiles breathe air. They have dry, scaly skin.
carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat).
herbivore	Animals that only eat plants
omnivore	Animals that eat both other animals and plants.
