Key Vocabulary

Alcohol	A clear liquid that burns easily and can be made from certain grains and fruits. Alcohol is present in such drinks as beer, wine, and whiskey. It is also used in making medicines and chemicals.
Illegal	Not allowed by law, especially criminal law.
Legal	Allowed by law.
Unit of alcohol	A measure to define the actual alcoholic content within a given volume of an alcoholic beverage, in order to provide guidance on total alcohol consumption.
Volume	The amount of space that a substance or object occupies, or that is enclosed within a container.
Media	The main means of mass communication (broadcasting, publishing, and the Internet) regarded collectively.
Addictive	A substance or activity causing or likely to cause someone to become addicted.
Unconscious	Not awake and aware of and responding to one's environment.
Vomit	Eject matter from the stomach through the mouth.
