Key vocabulary

trust	Firm belief in someone or something
betrayal	When someone you trust lies, cheats or hurts you.
forgiveness	To stop blaming or being angry with someone for something they did
Judas	One of the 12 disciples, he betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver
loyalty	Giving or showing firm support for something or someone
Peter	One of the 12 disciples, Jesus' closest friend and spread the word of Christianity
Gethsemane	A garden where Jesus prayed with his disciples the night before his arrest
Jerusalem	City where Jesus was taken as a child and later was crucified on Good Friday
authority	The power or right to give orders and make decisions

Corrie Ten Boom - hid Jews from the Nazis and went to prison.

Trust and betrayal for Jewish people in WW2

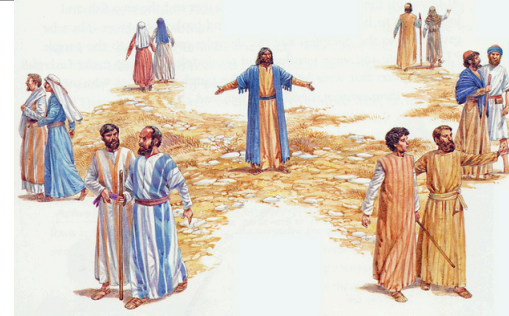
Anne Frank - hid in an attic from the Nazis.

Eric Lomax (The Railway Man) was a prisoner of war and forgave his captor.

TRUST

Jesus sends out the twelve

Matthew 10: 1-20



Jesus sent his disciples out and gave them the authority to preach, heal and bless people. He trusted them to do this for him.

Standing at the Cross

John 19:25-27



When Jesus was on the cross Jesus' mother, his aunt, Mary Magdalene and John stood with him.

BETRAYAL

Judas agrees to betray Jesus

Luke 22: 1-53



Judas went to the chief priests, who wanted to get rid of Jesus, and agreed to give them Jesus in exchange for money.

Peter disowns Jesus

Luke 22: 54-62



After Jesus is arrested someone asks Peter was Jesus with him and three times he denies that he knows him.
