Here are some suggestions to support your child's learning at home:

This term we will be learning about:



- Telling the time to the nearest minute.
- Fractions; counting in tenths, equivalent fractions, finding fractions of a set of objects, comparing and ordering.
- Recognising right angles and understanding how these relate to turns.

Times Tables

This term we will be consolidating learning the following times tables-

4 and 8

We will be having a strong focus on the related division facts this half-term.

For example:

 $2 \times 4 = 8$

 $4 \times 2 = 8$

8 divided by 2 = 4

8 divided by 4 = 2

have a times tables lesson every week to monitor and support their progress.
