You can support your child's learning at home in the following areas:

Maths

This half term we will be learning to:
Subtracting ones, tens and hundreds.



We will use 3-digit numbers and explore what happens when we subtract ones, tens or hundreds from this. We will investigate when and if renaming takes place.

Children are encouraged to use equipment to solve problems, before moving onto pictorial ways to solve and then more abstract methods.

They will continue to use number lines, part-whole models and Dienes blocks before moving onto column method for subtraction.

Times Tables

This half term we will be learning the following times tables and the corresponding division facts:

2, 5, 10, 3, and 4

For example:

$$2 \times 3 = 6$$

3 x 2 = 6

6 divided by 2 = 3

6 divided by 3 = 2
