

DAYS TO REMEMBER

• Children should wear their PE kit on their allocated PE day:

Monday Y1P, Thursday Y1H & Friday Y1S

- In Year 1 we change reading books on a Monday after school.. They will receive a new book on Tuesday each week. Children should bring their books in every day They should also access our online reading system Bug Club at least once per week.
- Spelling homework will be sent out on <u>Monday</u> and they will be tested on the <u>Monday</u> of the following week.

HOME/SCHOOL READING RECORDS

- Reading Records are to be used as a dialogue between school and home.
- Prompts and support are available inside the reading record, as well as information about our day-to-day practices.
- The left-hand side of the records are for any messages between school and home.
- The right-hand side is for school and home reading to be logged; please can parents and guardians ensure they record when they have read with their children. The diary must be signed at least three times per week.
- Reading Records should be brought in to school each day and taken home at the end of the day.
- Children's records contain passwords for our online platforms Bug Club and Purple Mash. Please encourage your children to use these at home weekly.

DATA COLLECTION FORMS

It is essential that we have all the relevant data on our system for your child. We are not sending new forms home so if your details have changed, please pop into the office and let them know. If the people who can collect your child/ren please inform the school office.

If your child's medical information changes throughout the academic year, please inform the office as it is vital for us to be able to provide the best care for your child.

SCHOOL MONEY

As you will be aware, we are now using the **SchoolMoney** App for payments of dinner money, milk money, before and after school club, toast and music money. Over the next few months we will be adding to this list to enable parents to pay for other things such as trips, clubs etc via the App.

This new payment system benefits both us as a school and you as a parent. Not only will you be able to pay for items from the comfort of your own home but you will also be able to access your account at any time to see if there is anything you need to pay for. **SchoolMoney** will enable us to experience a more streamlined, cost-effective and efficient payment system in a secure and safe environment.

If you have not used the system yet, please let us know and we will generate a new Welcome message for your **SchoolMoney** account where you can pay for any items we have requested from you.

To log into **SchoolMoney**, for the first time, visit the website www.eduspot.co.uk and click on the sign in button in the top right hand corner. In the drop down, select the **SchoolMoney Parent Login** option and this will send you through to a page where you need to enter your mobile number, email address, the password we have sent to you, and your child's first name.

If for any reason you are struggling to log in, it may be because you have not provided us with the correct contact details. Please let us know immediately if either your mobile number or email address changes. Please email admin.newton@sthelens.org.uk to advise us of any changes or for further information.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS/PUPIL PREMIUM/

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for Free School meals. You may be eligible if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance; Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run on; Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit (with an annual income of no more than £16,190.

If you are on any of the benefits below you can apply to St Helens council for Free School Meals. If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, school will also receive an additional amount of £1,320 per year for your child. This is called Pupil Premium. School can use this Pupil Premium funding to provide extra support in school for your child and also to help towards the costs of school trips, music lessons, Year 6 residential visits etc.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

• At Newton-le-Willows Primary School we believe that children can only learn effectively if they attend school regularly and they are punctual. Our aim is for **all** pupils to achieve at least 97% attendance.

• Morning Routine – reminder

- All school doors are closed at 9.00am and class registers are closed.
- Pupils arriving after 9.00am need to access school via the <u>school office and</u> will be marked late.
- Children arriving <u>after 9.30am</u> will be marked in the register as <u>unauthorised</u> <u>absence</u>.

Reporting a school absence

• If your child is unable to attend school due to illness please can you email, telephone or leave a message at the school office on the morning of illness **before**9.00am to report the reason for absence. If we receive no reason for an absence a member of staff will contact parents/carers to gain a reason for absence. This may be via a text message, phone call or email. If we are not able to reach you, we will leave a message for you to call us back with information about the absence. If parents/carers do not return our call this may lead to other safeguarding protocols being implemented.

UNIFORM

It is great to see so many of our pupils looking smart on their return to school!

Please ensure:

- School shoes are worn at all times trainers should not be worn unless there is a medical reason that school need to be made aware of beforehand.
- Hooded jackets are not able to be worn in place of a school jumper or a cardigan when the children are inside.
- Earrings should not be worn for PE but plasters may be used if necessary.
- Long hair is tied back.
- On PE days, children must wear school PE kit, NOT own clothes/football kits. On this day, children should come into school in their kit. Children do not need to get changed in school.
- All clothing must be clearly named.

ASSEMBLIES

Assemblies will be in phases (EYFS, KS1 and Year 3 and UKS2).

'Get Together' Assembly

These take place at the beginning of the week and focus on our school and British Values. Get Together assemblies are led by a member of the Senior Leadership Team in one of our school halls.

Picture News Assembly

These take place in class and focus on current affairs and worldwide issues. Picture News assemblies are led by the class teacher.

Celebration Assembly

These take place on a Friday and focus on celebrating the week. In these assemblies, we announce our class VIPs, Midday STRIVE award, STRIVE café award, PE student of the week and attendance winners. Children may bring in awards they have achieved outside of school that week in these assemblies (e.g. Footballer/Dancer of the week trophies from outside clubs etc). Celebration assemblies are led by Year Group Leaders in one of the school halls.

WRITING

- We teach Writing everyday at Newton. The children work through a range of objectives and activities taken from the English curriculum.
- Our Writing lessons are linked to and inspired by a range of high-quality reading books. Children are given the opportunity to write within a wide range of genres and for a variety of audiences and purposes.
- Children are taught discrete sessions of Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar across all year groups.

HOME READING

- Your child should be aiming to read at home at least three times per week (but preferably every night!) It is important that children read the book more than once to help them gain fluency and confidence in their reading.
- Your child's Reading Record should be signed by an adult to say they have read and feedback any difficulties or concerns within the week. Children are allowed and encouraged to read other books (as well as using Bug Club) on their own at home, but these do not replace their official school reading book.
- The wider the variety of reading material the children experience, the better.
- If you/your child lose a school reading book, please speak to your child's class teacher. These must be replaced at a cost of £4

THE TEACHING OF READING

• Guided reading and supported comprehensions happen twice a week (KS1).

- The children will read a text and answer a series of questions to develop their comprehension skills.
- They will also answer questions about the RWI text that they have read that week

PHONICS- READ WRITE INC

- Read Write Inc is a phonics scheme that we follow here at Newton. It begins in Nursery and children continue to take part in daily 45 minute sessions. The aim is for children to complete the scheme by the end of Year 1, but if necessary, they will continue to access sessions until they no longer need them.
- Children are placed into small groups according to their phonic knowledge and assessments are completed every half term.
- We teach the sounds first in a specific order.
- We then teach your children to blend those sounds together in order to read words
- The children read words in the matched Storybooks. Each Storybook is carefully matched to the sounds they can already read setting them up for success.

PHONICS SCREENING CHECK

The National phonics screening check is a statutory assessment that was introduced in 2012 to all Year 1 pupils and is a quick and easy check of your child's phonics knowledge.

All year 1 pupils will take the phonics screening check in 2024 during the week beginning 10th June. PLEASE TRY AND ENSURE THAT YOU DO NOT GO ON HOLIDAY DURING THIS TIME.

It comprises of a list of 40 real and nonsense words. It will assess phonics skills and knowledge learnt through reception and year 1. Your child will read one-one with a familiar teacher. Your child will read up to 4 words per page and they will probably do the check in 10-15 minutes. They will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together. The check is very similar to tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.

You will be informed of your child's progress in phonics and how he or she has done in the screening check, towards the end of the summer term in the end of year report. All of the children are individuals and develop at different stages. The screening check ensures that teachers understand which children need support with decoding.

The screening check will identify children who have phonic decoding skills below the level expected for the end of year 1 and who therefore need extra support. Children that do not meet the expected standard will be able to re-take the assessment in year 2.

SPELLINGS

• Every Friday, your child will bring home a list of spellings to learn. These are to be practised at home, ready for a spelling test on the Friday of the following week.

• These spellings are taken from the National Curriculum word lists and spelling appendices.

MATHS

- Children are taught Maths daily at Newton Primary.
- Objectives will be taught in a practical and fun way and time will be given for children to apply their knowledge independently through reasoning, problem-solving and reasoning activities across the week
- Children will have the opportunity to use and explore concrete, pictorial and abstract representations in Maths and must also follow the three main principles of maths: fluency, problem-solving and reasoning.
- Separate sessions will be dedicated to arithmetic.

Times Tables

Times tables are a very important part of mathematical knowledge and pupils who have difficulty with them in primary school will likely fall behind when they begin secondary school.

Through knowing their times tables, pupils will start to notice patterns and will then be able to apply this knowledge to more advanced work. As an example, knowing that $2 \times 3 = 6$ will help children understand that $20 \times 30 = 600$, and $200 \times 300 = 60,000$.

Being able to recognise these connections will, in turn, speed up their thinking processes and mental arithmetic, meaning they do not rely on a calculators for assistance.

It is important that children can also recall the associated division facts for each multiplication fact. For example, if they know that $6 \times 3 = 18$, they should also know that $18 \div 6 = 3$, and $18 \div 3 = 6$.

In year 1 we learn how to count in 2s,5s and 10s forwards and backwards By Year 4, children are expected to know all their multiplication facts up to 12x12.

Expectations

Year 1- Count in 2s, 5s and 10s forwards and backwards

Year 2 - Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables.

Year 3 - Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.

Year 4 -

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12x12.

Year 5 - Revision of all times tables and division facts up to 12x12.

Year 6 - Revision of all times tables and division facts up to 12x12.
