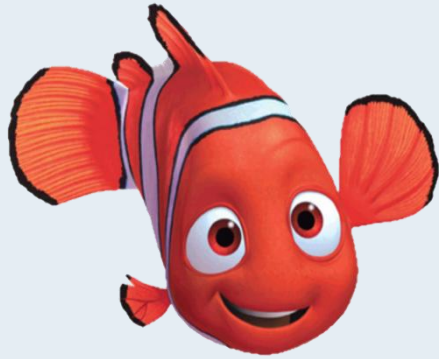

Class Size, Admissions and Admissions Procedure

Nursery: At present, there are two sessions in Nursery. A morning session and an afternoon session. Our nursery has a teacher and teaching assistant. There are approximately 26 children in each session.

Birth Certificate: DEADLINE by Wednesday 1st July 2025

Children who are eligible for 30-hour provision: The day will start and finish in line with the nursery times and parents must provide a packed lunch for their child. A small cost per day will be charged to cover lunchtime provision.

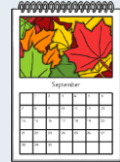

Early Years Curriculum

When your child starts at Newton, their first learning topic will be '**All About Me**'. This topic involves:

- **Personal, Social and Emotional Development** – Baseline. Settling into Nursery and building friendships.
- **Physical Development** - lots of opportunities to be outside developing their movement on bikes and scooters, opportunities for mark-making and funky finger activities.
- **Communication and Language** - Listening and attention, understanding and speaking through the general provision of the Nursery and circle time activities.
- **Literacy** - Baseline. stories that look at themselves and their families. Introduction to writing through mark making activities. once children are settled, they will start learning phonic sounds, one per week.
- **Mathematics** – Baseline. Verbal counting to 5 in order. Comparing height, talking and exploring shapes.
- **Understanding the World** – Baseline. Talking about their family, celebrating Harvest and Autumn.
- **RE**: talking about special times in their life.
- **Expressive Arts and Design** – music- nursery rhymes, instruments, dancing, role-play.

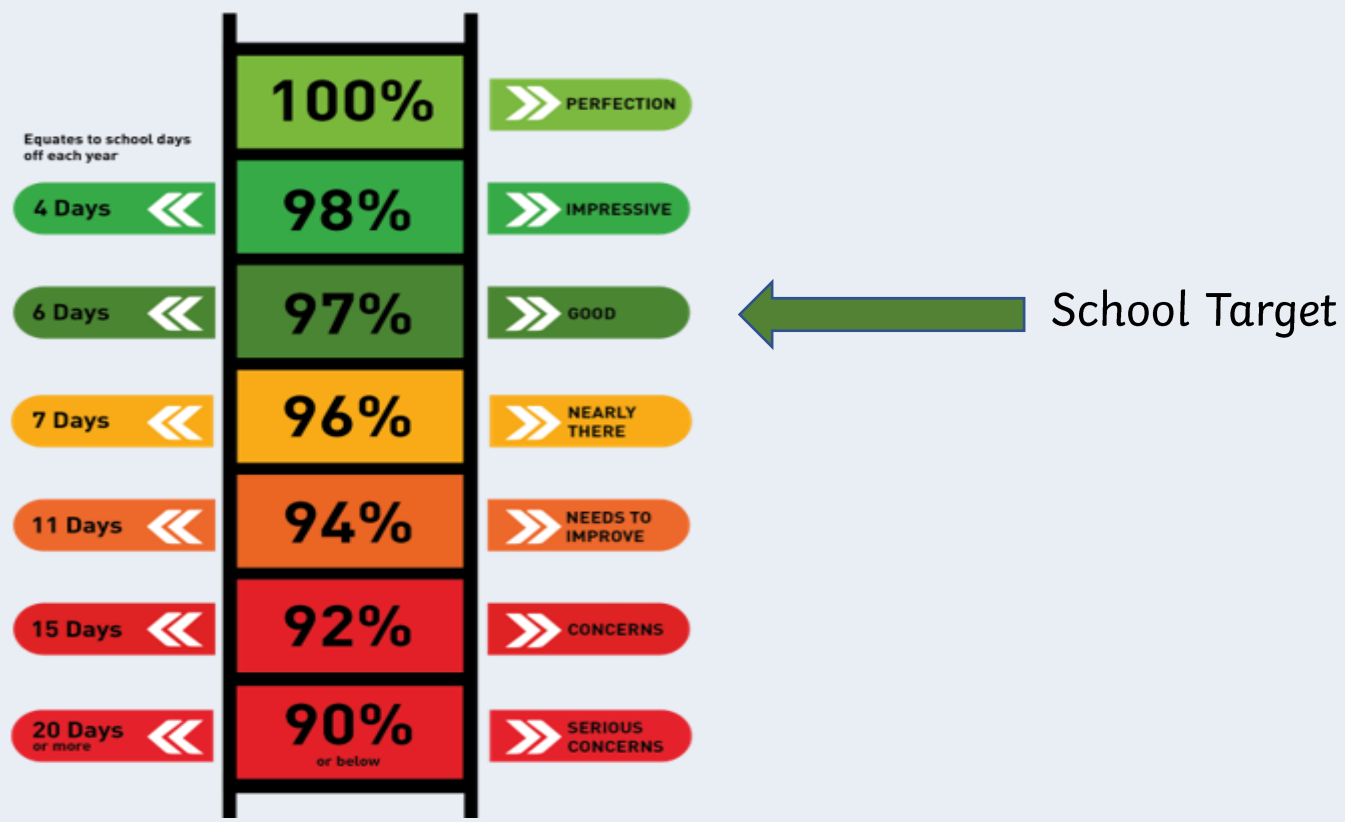

Nurture The Potential Succeed

Early Years Pupil Premium is a sum of money given to schools each year by the Government to improve the attainment of children. Eligible pupils can receive **£570 per year**.



Often, all of the children in a class will reap some benefits from how school uses its Pupil Premium.

You qualify for EYFS Pupil Premium, if you receive any of the following benefits:

- Universal credit (your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided that you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop applying for Working Tax Credit

Please let a member of staff know if you feel this is applicable to you.

Free School Meals (no known as Expanded Free School Meals)

You now also qualify for free school meals, if you receive any of the following benefits:

- **From September 2026**, eligibility for Free School Meals has been extended.
- Applications can now be made by all pupils from households receiving Universal Credit regardless of their household's annual income.

Please fill out the form in your school pack in case you may be eligible for free school meals.

Nurture The Potential Succeed

•**Service Pupil Premium** is a sum of money given to schools each year by the Government if pupils who have parents serving in the armed forces.

•**Looked After Pupils - Pupil Premium** is a sum of money given to schools each year by the Government if pupils are currently being looked after by the Local Authority or who have previously been looked after by the Local Authority.

Disability access fund

School could receive £938 or more per year to help with their education and support.

You can apply to get disability access funding if your child is aged 3 or 4 and you're receiving both:
