

<div>OS Map</div> 	<div>land use</div> <div>How people use land (e.g. farming, housing, shops)</div>	<div>settlement</div> <div>A place where people live.</div>	<div>economy</div> <div>How people use jobs, resources and trade to make money.</div>
	<div>urban</div> <div>An area with lots of buildings and people, like a town or city.</div>	<div>rural</div> <div>Countryside with farms, fields or small villages.</div>	<div>migration</div> <div>When people move to a different place.</div>
	<div>Ordnance Survey map (OS map)</div> <div>A detailed map of the UK showing land, roads, rivers etc.</div>	<div>aerial photograph</div> <div>A picture of land taken from above (by a plane, satellite or drone).</div>	<div>contour lines</div> <div>Lines of a map that show how high the land is.</div>
	<div>National Park</div> <div>A protected area of countryside for people, animals and plants.</div>	<div>trade</div> <div>The buying and selling of goods and services.</div>	<div>Grid reference</div> <div>A number that helps us find a location on a map.</div>
	<div>Key Skills</div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Can I use 4-figure grid references on OS maps?</li><li>● Can I compare local and contrasting areas of the UK?</li><li>● Can I sketch and annotate maps and landscapes?</li><li>● Can I explain why land is used in different ways?</li><li>● Can I identify how land use has changed over time?</li></ul>		<div>Key Knowledge</div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● The UK landscape has hills, mountains, rivers, coasts, and cities.</li><li>● Land can be used for farming, housing, industry, transport, leisure or tourism.</li><li>● OS maps use grid references and symbols to show land uses.</li><li>● Aerial photos and online maps help us see land use patterns.</li><li>● Early humans cleared forests to farm; Iron Age people built hill forts; modern times brought roads, railways and big cities.</li><li>● Land use has changed over time because of farming, population growth and industry.</li><li>● Different regions of the UK use land in different ways (e.g. London vs. Lake District).</li></ul>
