

Investigating the Islamic Civilisation

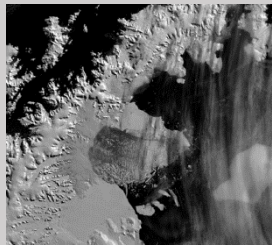
Born in 1874, Ernest Shackleton was the led the last great expedition of the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration. He and his crew set sail in August 1914 to cross the vast polar continent traveling via the South Pole. On his famous ship ‘Endurance’, his crew successfully completed their perilous journey without losing a member of the 26 strong crew having faced numerous challenges.

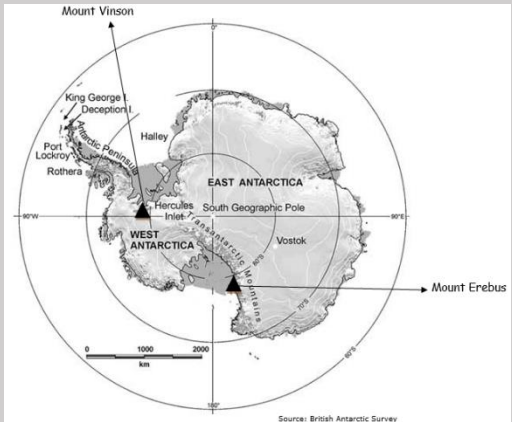

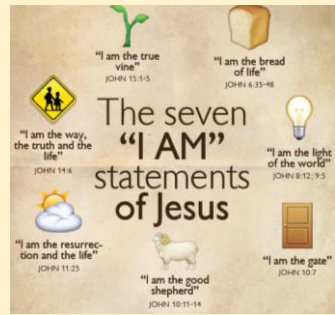
Who is Jesus?

Did Jesus even exist?

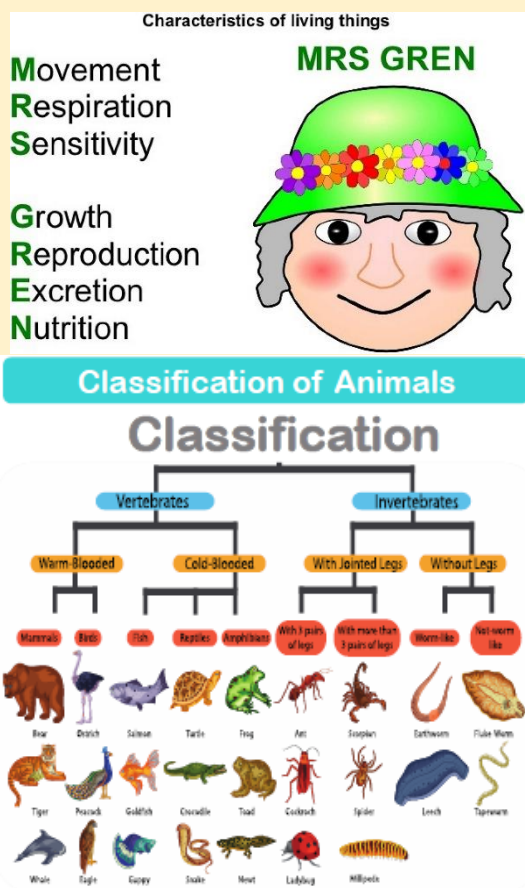

Courageous Advocate – Ernest Shackleton

Born in 1874, Sir Ernest Shackleton is best known as a legendary Anglo-Irish Antarctic explorer, renowned for his exceptional leadership and the miraculous survival of his crew during the 1914–1916 *Endurance* expedition. Despite failing to achieve the first land crossing of Antarctica, he is celebrated for ensuring all his men survived after their ship was crushed by ice. This daring feat of exploration was the last great exhibition of the Age of Antarctic Expedition.
