




Our Wonderful Winter Reading Recommendations




'The Christmas Tree Mouse' by Waterstones Children's Laureate Joseph Coelho and debut illustrator Farah Shah.


Reading Age: 3–6 years.




The bestselling 'The Snow Thief' by Alice Hemming and Nicola Slater.


This laugh out loud book is suitable for reading ages 3–6 (or whoever wants to read it!)
