School will close for the Christmas break on **Friday 19**<sup>th</sup> **December 2025** and re-open for pupils on **Tuesday 6**<sup>th</sup> **January 2026. Monday 5**<sup>th</sup> **January 2026** is a staff training day the focus of which is on 'Zones of Regulation', Safeguarding and Behaviour support.

During the break school will be closed. Should you have and significant concerns about a child the **Cheshire i-ART** (Integrated Access and Referral Team) is the main point of contact in **Cheshire West** and **Chester** for concerns about child welfare, abuse, or neglect, handling referrals during office hours (Mon-Thurs 8:30-5, Fri 8:30-4:30) via **0300 123 7047 (option 1)**.

For urgent out-of-hours help, contact the **Emergency Duty Team** (EDT) at **01244 977277**, or call **Police** (101/999) if immediate danger.

The teams above work to safeguard children by coordinating responses to abuse and harm within the community.

I want to finish by thanking all the pupils, staff and families for their support, hard work and close support working- it makes a huge difference to the outcomes for young people.

I hope everyone is able to take time out over the Festive and New Year period to rest and relax as we move into 2026, with confidence, pride and excitement of the opportunities that are to come.
