




We kindly ask for your support in completing our Home School Agreement and returning it to us as soon as possible.

This agreement helps strengthen the partnership between school and families, ensuring we work together to create the best possible learning environment for every child.




Wonderful work this week




Fantastic work in Y5/6 this week.

Firstly, Maisie and Ava have worked incredibly hard in Science, recording lots of information about species classification – they would now appear to be bird experts with their impressive knowledge!


Annabelle has also produced some beautiful collage work in Art this week. The attention to detail is amazing. Well done!

Message from Mrs Gaulton


Another busy week this week as we all settle back in to week 2 of the school routine.




Mr Smith's PE Awards
