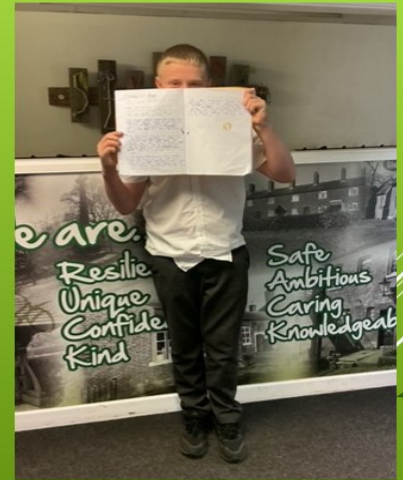
## Wonderful work this week



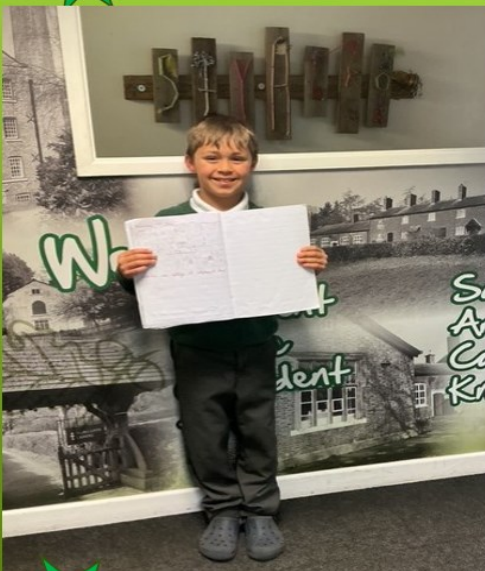
Very well done to **Annabelle** and **Rees** in **Y6** this week who have produced some superb fiction writing in their English lessons.

We were particularly impressed by our Y3/4 children who competed after an afternoon of swimming too!

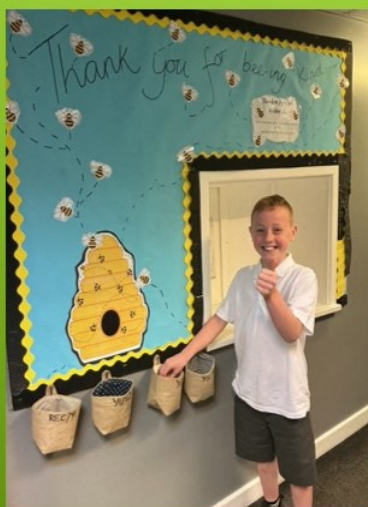
Thank you to Mrs Dux & Mr Rezzano for running our Cross Country practice sessions and to Mrs Hennessey for supporting the children at the competition.

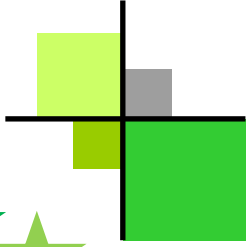

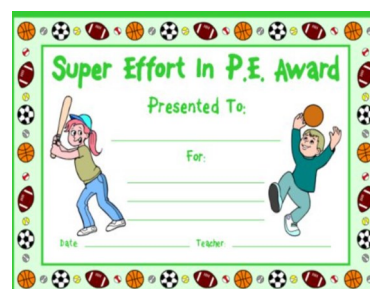
