

Literacy

This term, we will be reading books all about "Fantastic Fantasies." We will read books such as *George and the Dragon*, *The Reluctant Dragon* and non-fiction texts. These books link to our History topic: Castles.

For our 'Discovering Dinosaurs' we will be reading *Stop that Dinosaur!* And *How to look after a Dinosaur*. In our writing we will continue to work on applying our phonics and choosing the correct graphemes. We will look at spelling tricky words accurately, using finger spaces and continue developing our knowledge of punctuating sentences with capital letters and full stops. We will begin to write questions and explore some instruction writing.

Art & DT

In Art, we will be looking at the process of printing. We will think about different printing techniques.

To then link with our History topic, we will design and create our own Royal trinket box.

History and Geography

Linked to our 'Fantastic Fantasies' topic, we will be looking at the history of Castles. We will learn about the Battle of Hastings, suits of armour, who lived in castles and why they were important.

In Geography, we will be learning about the United Kingdom; the four countries that make up the UK, and their Capital Cities.

Maths

In Maths, we will continue to explore how numbers can be 'composed' and 'decomposed', using the language of 'whole' and 'parts'.

We will focus on shape and how they are made, looking at the differences between 2D and 3D shapes. We will develop our spatial awareness.




We will begin to explore addition and subtraction, looking at the symbols used. We will then move on to writing our own expressions using the knowledge we have learnt.

Science

In Science, we will continue to observe Seasonal Changes in Forest School, the school grounds and learn about Everyday Materials.

The children will distinguish between objects and what they are made from, name different everyday materials, describe the simple properties of materials and group objects by these properties.

Computing/Music

In Computing, we will be learning about digital literacy. We will look particularly at information from different sources and the differences between information that is personal and not personal. We will recognise unkind behaviour online.

In Music, we will be exploring different musical instruments with Mrs Porrett.

Religious Education

In RE, we will be exploring the concept of "Who is Jewish and how do they live?"

We will look at Jewish artefacts, how Jews celebrate special times and the stories linked to these celebrations, the words of a Jewish prayer - the Shema and how Jewish people remember God in different ways.

PE Days

Our PE session will be on a **Thursday** morning.

All children must have navy blue or black shorts or jogging bottoms, a school PE t-shirt (red, blue, green or yellow), trainers or pumps to change into in school.

PE kits can be left in school, in your child's locker.
