How have Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Louis Braille changed the world?

HISTORY FOCUS

Louis Braille— a French inventor of a system of reading and writing for use by the blind or visually impaired

Florence Nightingale—was an English social reformer and the founder of modern nursing

Mary Seacole— Mary Jane Seacole was a British-Jamaican nurse, healer and businesswoman who set up the "British Hotel" behind the lines during the Crimean War

Sir Alastair Pilkington and Kenneth Bickerstaff invented the Float Glass Process

Thomas Beecham—the founder of Beechams, a large pharmaceutical business

Hospitals: Florence influenced the cleanliness of the hospitals and hospitals today have much better conditions. Mary broke social rules and prejudices to travel the world, run businesses and help those in need – even in the most dangerous places.

Education for blind people: blind and partially sighted people can now access reading materials using braille.

Industry in St Helens: the glass industry has continued to provide jobs for St Helens but not in the same form.


