- Listening to what children in our class want and sharing their ideas.

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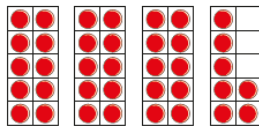

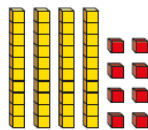
