I can identify nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs.

Word Type	Definition	Examples
Noun	Names a person, place, or thing	owl, tree, forest, wing
Verb	A doing or being word (an action)	fly, hoot, sleep, hunt
Adjective	Describes a noun	wise, fluffy, silent, golden
Adverb	Describes how, when or where something happens	quickly, quietly, softly, gracefully

It watched the forest carefully, waiting for a tiny mouse to appear.
Then it swooped swiftly through the dark night.
