Martyn's Law

At school we are getting ready to implement procedures that will be necessary due to Martyn's Law. (Martyn's Law, officially the <u>Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Act 2025</u>, is UK legislation that requires publicly accessible locations to have plans to protect the public from terrorism.) Schools will be required to have standard security measures in place, including protocols for evacuation, lockdown and invacuation. Due to this, on 21st November at 9.20am we will be doing a lockdown drill at school. We will be making it as light and stress free as we can, and talking at length to the

News from Reception

This week in Reception we have learnt all about the traditions of Bonfire Night and how it started with Guy Fawkes. We read the story, Sparks in the Sky, before sharing our own experiences and then comparing it to the festival of Diwali. We learnt all about how to stay safe around a bonfire and fireworks; the children made sparklers that we used as part of a safety role play session. In maths, we have focused on the composition of 1, 2 and 3 before adding one more and finding one less. In RE, we shared our own experiences of birthday celebrations as we begin our journey of the Christmas story.

News from Class 2

This week, our imaginations have taken us on incredible adventures as we described different settings, and imagined what life might be like on another planet. In maths, we've been busy finding the difference and practising our subtraction skills. Science has been full of creativity as we made our own weather mobiles, learning all about different types of weather along the way. We've also started an exciting new geography topic. We have been using atlases, exploring aerial maps of Bollington, and spotting places we know well.

News from Class 3

Class 3 has had a fantastic week. We have been looking at column subtraction in maths. Science has been a lot of fun as we built skeletons and looked at why we have a skeleton. In geography, we reconstructed the Earth and its layers - digging into what each layer is made of. In RE, we had a lovely time looking at Jesus being the light of the world and making lanterns with how we could be a shining example to others.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have started our unit on fractions, converting improper fractions into mixed numbers and visa versa. In English, we have started work on 'The Unforgotten Coat' by Frank Cottrell Boyce. We have made predictions about what may happen in the story. In science, we explored hardness of different materials, and, in geography, we completed map work about the location of the Alps. We have also enjoyed creating some amazing artwork linked to Remembrance Day, and we enjoyed our NSPCC workshop on Thursday.
