News from Reception

This week in Reception we have enjoyed learning all about the planet Mars. We took part in Mars Day and watched some incredible videos taken from the current Mars Rover. We designed our own Mars Rovers, considering what important jobs it would need to do; we then made the robots using Lego. We created artwork using marbling inks and we wrote sentences about what we know about Mars. In maths we have focused on length and height, using the words, tallest, shortest and longest to describe different objects. We all had a wonderful World Book Day exploring new stories and discovering some exciting characters. A huge thank you to the Year 6 reading buddies for taking the time to come and read to us.

News from Class 2

Class 2 have had a lovely week. The sun has been shining and we have really been enjoying the brighter weather. We have started working in our garden to get it ready for spring, doing lots of weeding, and we are looking forward to beginning our planting over the next couple of weeks. We really enjoyed celebrating World Book Day. We guessed book titles, read in unusual places, swapped books with friends and wrote character descriptions. In maths this week, we have been practising mixed addition and subtraction sums. We have also been exploring the school grounds looking for signs of spring and drawing what we have spotted.

News from Class 3

This has been a fantastically busy week in Class 3. We have been looking into fractions in maths and even got to sneak some chocolate into the lesson. In English we had some fun working on poems and a character description of a spoon character. Science was an interesting topic as we started to learn about what and who is indigenous to the Amazon rainforest. We looked at betrayal and who betrayed Jesus over the Easter period in RE. We discussed how we could learn from this to be a better friend to others.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been learning how to find percentages of numbers, by firstly finding 10% or 1% and then using these answers to work out various percentages. In English, we have started exploring the book, 'The Hidden Forest' by Jeannie Baker, looking at the amazing forests underneath our oceans. We have been exploring how the main character's feelings and emotions develop and change throughout the story. In computing, we have started our unit on Micro:Bits, learning how to connect them to the laptops and create a simple program, and, in science, we have been learning all about the circulatory system.
