

News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have learnt all about the amazing festival of Chinese New Year. We looked at the traditions of this celebration, focusing on the food, decorations and gifts before making our own lanterns and lucky red envelopes. We learnt all about the story of the Emperor and Zodiac which led to us acting out The Great Race and practising our ordinal numbers. We enjoyed a full afternoon of activities with Class Two, ranging from Mandarin speaking lessons and character painting to dragon dancing. Our Talent Show has been a big focus this week with some fantastic effort put in to our practice time. As the week has come to an end, we have moved on to introducing our next topic of Space; we have gathered all of our initial ideas and questions so we can plan what we'd like to know more about.

News from Class 2

This week in Class 2, we have started reading our new story, The Journey Home. The book has inspired thoughtful discussions about what our world might look like without the impact of humans. As a result, they produced imaginative descriptive writing. In maths, we have been developing our understanding of mixed addition and subtraction, using number lines to support us. In art, we created charcoal observational drawings of living things, studying details and adding tone and textures. We have also thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the talent show – it has been fantastic to see the children share their skills and talents.

News from Class 3

This has been a very busy week in Class 3. They have settled in really well after the half term break and got straight into their work. In maths, we started a new topic of fractions and started to recap what a denominator and numerator is and how fractions work when ordering them. In English, we kicked off our new book Cinnamon and started to predict what we thought would happen and what evidence we could find in the text. Our science topic involves our digestive system and the organs that make it all work. In geography, we have started to look at why rainforests are important and what we can find in each layer of the rainforest. Finally, in RE, the children have started to look at how in the Easter story Christians had to trust Jesus and what was going to happen.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been learning how to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages. In English, we have started to explore a new Literacy Tree book, called 'Can we save the tiger?' by Martin Jenkins and Vicky White, and we have also been recapping on our key grammatical terms. In geography, we have started to answer our key enquiry questions for this half-term: 'Would you like to live in the desert?' We have been exploring where the different biomes are located in the world and have been learning about the characteristics of the desert biome, and we have explored the Mojave Desert.

Sports News

Class 1 – As part of our Chinese New Year study week, we have taken part in several music and movement sessions using traditional Chinese music and drums.

Class 2 – The children were looking at target practice games and working in a team. The children were in groups of three and had to take turns landing their bean bag inside their team's hoop. If they did this, they would get to move their hoop one space forward. We added different rules to make the game easier and harder. We then played games involving hoops, in which we would play games including passing the hoop, spinning the hoop and making the hoop return to whoever threw it.

Class 3 – This week, the class participated in tag rugby and athletics. In tag rugby, the children focused on passing techniques going from low to high and making sure to throw backwards. In athletics, the children were split into two groups. One group were doing their standing high jump and receiving a score based on their reach and jump. The other group had a curling match which some children had seen during the Winter Olympics.

Class 4 – Due to weather, we had a big athletics tournament with children scoring their high jump and competing in a league table. The children then were split into groups for a curling tournament, learning how to score and block, and we focused on target practice.
