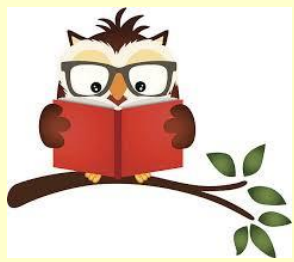

Reading

- Reading is the priority in KS1 as it is the gateway to learning.
- How we decide which level book your child brings home. Some children will read decodable books and others will read book banded books.
- Please send reading folders with book and diary into school every day. Books will be changed once per week.
- Please ensure that your child reads to you at least 3 times a week but every night is great if possible. (10 minutes). Write a short comment or sign each time.
- Decodable books are supposed to be easy. Children should not come across any sounds that they don't know. The aim is to develop confidence, fluency and expression. They should practise so that they are able to read it just like they are talking.



Reading - Continued

- Book banded books are to focus more on comprehension. It is important that your child can not only read the words but that they understand what they have read.
- Guided Reading - we read in ability groups each week. This reading session focuses on comprehension. This will be the day that we change your child's reading book. If it is not ready to be changed on this day please ask your child to come and let us know when it needs changing.

Here are some examples of questions you might ask your child:

- Re-tell the story in your own words.
- What do you think might happen next? Why do you think that? Base answers on what has already happened in the text.
- What do think about that character? Give opinion and back up with evidence from the text.
- Which words tell you that the character was scared?
- Don't forget it is still important that you read to your child. Model expression, tone, voices, stopping at full stops etc

Spellings/Phonics

The year 2 spelling scheme follows on from phonics. This focuses on spelling rules and applying the phonics learned in previous years.

Children need to be able to spell the high frequency and common exception words from EY and Year 1. We will be working on the Year 2 words over the year.

Any children who need it will get extra phonics interventions.



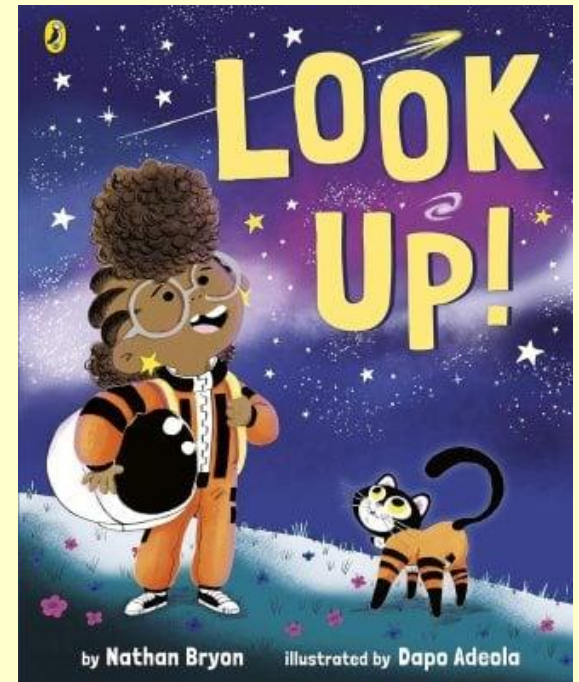
English

Areas of learning this half term are:

- Plan or say out loud what is going to be written about.
- Use punctuation correctly - full stops, capital letters.
- Use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify.
- Use subordination (because) and coordination (and).

Learning outcome:

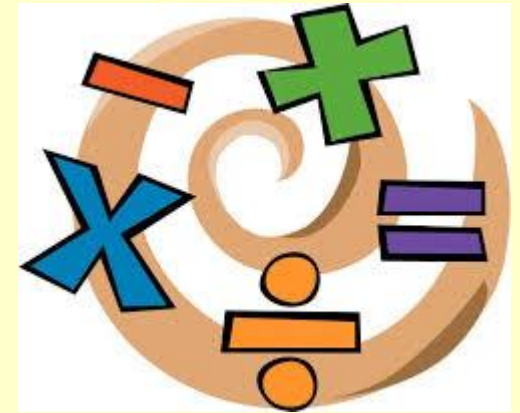
A story based on the model text.



Maths

Areas of learning this term are:

- Place Value
- Addition and subtraction
- Shape
- Time



Please talk to your children when opportunities for maths present themselves in the real world. E.g. baking, shopping, distance etc so they can see practical applications of maths.

Children need to be able to tell the time on an analogue clock (o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to).

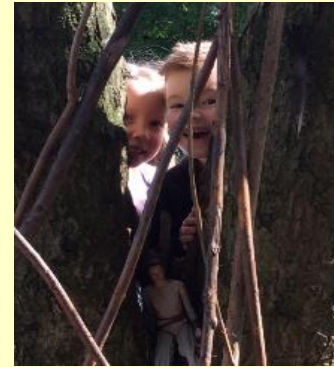
