

# Reading Challenge

Pick 3 descriptive words from the text, write them down and explain why you think the author used them.	Re-read a section of your book. Pick out 5 powerful phrases or sentences. Explain how they affect the reader.	Make up 3 questions you would use to check someone has read the book carefully.
Draw a picture of the main character and write a description of them and what their character is like.	Find words you don't understand in the story, write down their meanings from a dictionary.	Look at a non-fiction book. Find an interesting page. Explain why it is set out as it is.
Design a poster advertising the book. Remember to write on the poster why people should read it.	Draw a picture of one of the settings in the book; write words/phrases from the book around the setting to describe it.	Write the main events from a story as a story mountain.
Write an alternative ending to the story.	Write a new blurb for the back of the book.	Write a short play based on the story.
Write a letter to the main character in the story telling them what others think of them and why.	Write a list of 5 questions you would like to ask the author about the book.	Write about your favourite part of the story and explain why you have chosen it.

Questions for either fiction or non-fiction books.

In your reading book which character are you most like and why?	Which character in your reading book would you like to be friends with, why?	Who else should read your book? Why? Who shouldn't read it? Why?
Using speech bubbles, draw a conversation between two characters from your book.	Write a diary extract for one of the characters.	Choose two books by the same author and compare them. Write a list of similarities and differences.
From a non-fiction book write a list of a least 5 things you have learnt	From a non-fiction book write a glossary of technical words used – at least 5.	After reading a non-fiction book write a list of questions you still want to know the answers to about that topic.
Write a summary of the story in no more than 200 words.	Find a story set in the past. Find at least 5 clues that tell you it is set in the past	Go to the library and choose a book. Write down why you chose that book.
Make a list of books with a similar theme – explain how they are similar.	Finish the sentence 'I like the way the author...' then explain your thinking.	Which book do you want to read next and why?
