



Dear Parents, Carers and Families

It's been another busy week here at HPS. We've welcomed prospective Early Years 2026 parents and their children to the second round of our open events, Year 5 have been visited by Mr Ranjev Singh from Guru Nanak Dev Ji Gurdwara, 3HE are continuing with their swimming lessons and the first of this year's sporting fixtures have got underway.

# A Sporting Update from Mr Cairns

On Tuesday, the Year 5/6 girls' football teams went to Hartford High School for the first tournament of the year. We were the only school to take two teams to the tournament, which gave 18 girls the chance to represent their school. Both teams played against Hartford Manor, Barnton, Charles Darwin and Winnington Park, as well as playing each other.

The B team improved throughout the tournament, learning rules and skills as they went. They had a great team spirit and kept going right until the end when Keanna scored a fantastic goal. Well done girls!

The A team played fantastically throughout. They rotated goalkeepers and did not concede a goal in the whole tournament. They scored some amazing goals and won the tournament overall. They will now go to Winsford Academy on 10<sup>th</sup> November for the Partnership Final. Well done to everyone who took part.

Moving on to some more general points regarding safety during PE lessons and sporting fixtures:

Shoelaces - I have noticed this year that a lot of children have trainers with shoelaces but cannot tie their own laces without help from an adult. Could all parents please try to teach their children to do this over the half term break? Any child who learns this skill should let me know in their PE lesson and I will award them 10 aspiration tokens for their class.

Earrings - A reminder that children have to either take their earrings out or use their own tape to cover their earrings whilst they are taking part in PE. Please either teach your child to remove their earrings so that they can put them in their tray during PE or show them how to tape them up themselves. Again any child who learns to remove their earrings over the half term holiday will receive 10 aspiration tokens for their class.

Selection for Sports Events – We are very proud of our sporting achievements here at HPS and try to enter every sports event available to us, whether they be competitive or just for fun. The majority of the events are run by the Vale Royal School Sports Partnership who are based at Hartford High School. These events are aimed at different children. Inspire events are aimed at the most able children and the winners of these competitions will progress to the Partnership Finals. Aspire events are aimed at children who enjoy PE at school and are ready to attend a competition. These events are less competitive and do not have a pathway to a 'next' round. Celebrate events are non-competitive events and are aimed at children who are less confident in PE and want to compete in a fun atmosphere with no pressure.

A lot of thought goes into which children attend each event. Every child in Year 5 and 6 will be chosen for an event at some point in the year. The Year 3 and 4 children, who are ready, may attend an event and in the meantime the children can attend the competitions that the Year 6 children run at lunch times. Unfortunately, I'm unable to inform every parent why their child has not been selected for individual events. Please trust that I will choose your child for an appropriate competition when they are ready. Thank you for your support.
