Welcome back to Autumn 2, I hope you've all enjoyed the half term break and any Halloween and Bonfire Night events that you may have attended with your family. This next half term is always a busy one with the run up to Christmas and all that entails. I know the PTA are already busy preparing for their "Sparkles Over School" event on 28th November and of course the staff are planning for nativities and Christmas performances. Here's a round up of our news so far:

On Wednesday this week our Early Years and Year 3 children welcomed Rebecca Gaskell into school to enhance their learning about Hinduism and Diwali. As part of her visit she taught the children the art of Bollywood dancing. The children enjoyed listening to the music and learning some new moves, such as the crab mudra and the lion mudra. By the end of the session, they were able to put their moves together to perform a dance routine.

Instead of our usual Picture News assembly this week I talked to the children on Tuesday about the next module in the My Happy Mind Programme. We began to talk about:

- What Character Strengths are and why they matter.
- How to recognise Character Strengths in ourselves.
- How understanding Character Strengths can make us feel.

We will be continuing this work in class over the next half term.

Attendance

Whole school attendance up until Friday 24th October was 97.22%. We had 34 children recorded as late the week before half term. I'm delighted to report however that this week we've only had 18 children recorded as late, which is a significant improvement. A Sporting Update from Mr Cairns

On Friday 17th October, two teams of Year 3 and 4 boys headed to Hartford High School for a non-competitive football event. Both teams had a great time playing against children at a similar level and learning new skills. They all showed amazing sporting values and scored some wonderful goals. Well done everyone!

On Tuesday 21st October, two Year 5 and 6 boys football teams went to Hartford High. This was an Inspire competition which means the organisers keep score, announce the winners and there is progression to the next round of the competition. The B team found the start of the tournament tricky as the standard was high. They lost their first few games but once they got their first goal that all changed. They won the next two games and then grabbed a draw to finish very strongly. The A team won every game at the tournament and only conceded one goal, meaning they will go to the next round on Friday 7th November. Well done to all the boys who took part.

The first tournament of the year run by the Create Learning Trust for Year 3 and 4 boys was held at Hartford Primary School on Thursday 23rd October. Sandiway, Cuddington and Little Leigh Schools all came along and played some lovely passing football. Great values were shown by all the players, especially Jackson who even played for Little Leigh for one half to help them out. The refereeing from the Year 6 children was of the highest quality and they didn't even have VAR! Our team won all three matches and won the tournament, well done boys!

The first tournament for November was a Year 5 and 6 basketball event which took place this Tuesday. The children at Hartford High School put on some excellent basketball skills sessions for the team when they were not playing a match to improve their skills. On court, the team were brilliant. They defended aggressively, shot like they were in the NBA and made the right choices with their passes. They won every match and will now play in the second round in December. Well done everyone!
