### A Sporting Update from Mr Cairns

The Year 5/6 basketball team went to Rudheath Academy for the Vale Royal Partnership Final on Tuesday this week. They started where they left off in the first round, winning their first two games without conceding a point. They then came up against two very strong teams. Hartford defended well and scored a couple but could not find a way past the opposition. A third place finish was well deserved. The team were awarded the Spirit of the Games certificate at the end for the team who showed the best sporting values throughout the tournament. Well done boys!

The Year 6 football team headed off to Crewe yesterday having already won 4 tournaments this year. 16 of the strongest sides went to Crewe Academy with only the winners going through to the North Final. The group stages were straight forward with the team finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> after 5 wins and 2 defeats. This put them into a semi-final against Winsford High Street. A last minute goal meant they avoided the dreaded penalty shoot-out. It wasn't avoided for long though as Mablin Primary School defended well and hung on for a 0-0 draw. Penalties went to sudden death where we squeezed through in nail-biting fashion.

The final against Highfield Primary was a good game. Highfield edged the first half 1-0 but in the second half we played some great football to draw level. Unfortunately, we conceded from a corner with almost the last kick of the game to lose 2-1. The boys were upset at the end but still showed good sporting values, shaking hands with the other team and thanking the referee. Well done boys!

Just from three parents support we will have had over £2k in match funding - it really makes a HUGE difference... and the coffee morning will be match funded too.
