On Tuesday, the Year 5 and 6 indoor athletics team went to Rudheath Academy for the Vale Royal Partnership Final. Having already won one round, they were taking on the 8 strongest teams in the area. The event was of a very high

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standard and run in a great atmosphere. The children performed brilliantly, winning running races as well as throwing, jumping and bouncing events. When the final results were announced, Hartford came a very close 2<sup>nd</sup> to Davenham. Well done to everyone who took part.

Our KS2 children have been learning about the Winter Olympics in assembly today. Each class has been allocated a country to support, and an extra playtime will be awarded to the class whose country comes highest in the medal table!
