

Prime Area: Personal, Social and Emotional development (PSED)

Children will focus on the idea of managing ourselves and our wellbeing.

Children will join in with discussions about living health lifestyles and noticing changes to our bodies after physical exercise.

Children will discuss their next transition and moving up to Year 1.

Children will learn about Spreading the Word and The Miraculous Catch of Fish

Children will explore the theme 'Dialogue and Encounter' and discuss the idea of 'The Dignity of Work Stewardship'

Specific Area: Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

Children will learn about and create their own agamograph

Children will make something that can be used in play and that works, for example a kite or a thaumatrope

Children will continue with weekly singing and music lessons.

Children will learn and use new vocabulary within continuous provision linked to our How things work topic.

Children will use talk to develop their ideas and narratives during adult led and child led activities.

Children will partake in weekly C&L lessons.

Specific Area: Understanding the World (UW)

Children will begin to learn about their new classes. They will have transition days and visits to their new class and teacher.

Children will bring in toys from home to discuss what they look like and how they work.

Children will understand how to use tools safely and how to be safe in our play.

Prime Area: Physical Development (PD)

Children will be involved in weekly PE lessons.

Children will continue to build independence in dressing/undressing and managing their personal care routine.

Children will take part in weekly handwriting sessions (M Harvey scheme) and Fab 5 fine motor activities.

Children will take part in physical activities linked to outdoor learning and indoor physical activities e.g. Go noodle, dough disco.

Specific Area: Literacy

Children will explore books linked to the topic – How things work: The Three Little Pigs, Michael Recycle , The Bug Collector and My Grandpa's Amazing Inventions.

Children will write for different purposes, focusing on the genres, making a diary entry, adapting stories and creating a fact file.

Children will continue to learn new to segment, blend and read new words and tricky words as we move onto Summer 2 of our Little Wandle phonic scheme.

Specific Area: Mathematics

Children will begin to compare mass, find balance, explore capacity and look at length and measuring.

Children will identify 3D shapes.

Children will manipulate, compose and decompose shapes.

Children will copy, continue and create more complex patterns.

Children will visualise, build and map scenes.
