Gospel Reflection



John 1:29-34 "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."

:Our assembly and reflections in class this week move on from the Baptism of the Lord last week, to John's recount to followers of this encounter with Jesus. In doing so, John the Baptist points Jesus out as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."

Jesus is the Lamb – gentle, humble, pure, but powerful enough to carry away the weight of all of our mistakes, our sin and our failures. John's words invite us to reflect on the significance of this. Do we truly allow Jesus into our lives, to carry our burdens and our needs?

John also tells us about the Spirit descending upon Jesus like a dove – a quiet, gentle sign that He is God's Chosen One. His beloved Son. We are reminded to trust Jesus with our struggles, our fears and our troubles. Forgiveness is a gift freely given by God's Lamb, Jesus. May we trust in Him and let the Holy Spirit be with us and guide us in our lives.

Please could you log into our school app, School Gateway, and give consent for your child to be able to attend the visit. We ask that you do this before Wednesday 28th January.

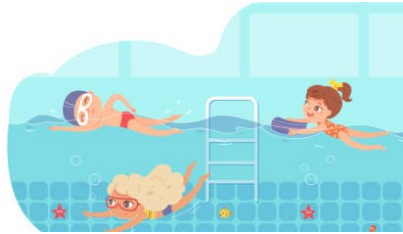
A letter will be sent home on Monday with further details.
