Short bursts of learning followed by structured activities/play


- Independent carousel activities

- ▶ The other is a phonics book for your child to read to you independently

#### X3 Reading sessions at school:


- ▶ 1 = decoding

## Home Learning:

- ► Home learning to be handed in/completed by following Wednesday

   (e.g. if a different person is picking up at home time or your child has an appointment during the school day)


