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Reading Skills	Word Reading: • To apply phonic knowledge and skills as the route to decode words • To blend sounds in unfamiliar words using the GPCs that they have been taught • To respond speedily, giving the correct sound to graphemes for all of the 40+ phonemes • To read words containing taught GPCs • To read words containing -s, -es, -ing -ed and -est endings • To read words with contractions, e.g. I'm, I'll and we'll • To read Y1 common exception words • To reread texts to build up fluency and confidence in word reading	Comprehension: • To check that a text makes sense to them as they read and to self- correct • To listen to and discuss a wide range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry at a level beyond that at which they can read independently • To link what they have read or have read to them to their own experiences • To retell familiar stories in increasing detail • To join in with discussions about a text, taking turns and listening to what others say • To discuss the significance of titles and events • To discuss word meaning and link new meanings to those already known • To begin to make simple inferences • To predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far • To recite simple poems by heart
Writing Skills	• Work can be read and understood by an unfamiliar adult. • Write 3- 4 sentences that are sequenced to form a short narrative. • Demarcate 90% of sentences with full stops. • Demarcate 65% of sentences with a capital letter. • Segment words into phonemes and represent these with graphemes, spelling 65% correctly. Other words should be phonetically plausible. • Spell all of the phase 2-4 common exception words correctly. • Form all lower-case letters correctly, starting and finishing in the right place. • Form most 90% of letters of the correct size relation to one another. • Use spacing between words consistently. • Form all digits correctly, starting and finishing in the right place. • Many suffixes applied correctly as identified in the year 1 spelling appendix.
