In the February half term, William from Violet Class and his dad are doing the Three Peaks Challenge to raise money for his annual Scout Camp in August.



ACTIVE TRAVEL POSTER COMPETITION 2026

We are inviting children who have taken part in Bikeability (Level 1 & 2) in South Cheshire to take part in an ACTIVE TRAVEL poster competition. The aim of the competition is to encourage youngsters to be more active and be safer on the roads especially when riding their bikes.

We appreciate that schools have a curriculum to follow and finding time to take part in this type of activity isn't always possible in school time. However, some of the children might wish to create a poster in their own time, so hopefully schools will encourage the children's parents/guardians (via the school newsletter) to get involved.

The competition winner and runner-up will receive a certificate and a bag of goodies as prizes.

All entries will be collected from the schools before the Easter school holidays by the competition organisers, who alongside a local member of the emergency services, will judge the competition.

Please contact the organisers (see Email addresses below) if your school wishes to take part so we can arrange to collect the posters from the school.

DETAILS OF COMPETITION

Create a A4 size POSTER that ENCOURAGES ACTIVE TRAVEL in a safe manner.
(cycling, walking, scootering and wheeling or using public transport)

Posters should be 'eye-catching' and highlight the benefits and the various ways to take part in Active Travel in a clear and creative way. Use paint, crayon, felt pen or pencil for your creation. And don't forget to put your name and your school on the back of the poster!

Examples of Active Travel:

- Using a safe walking route like a footpath
- Cycling, scooting or skateboarding safely to school
- Riding with a parent if you're still learning road safety skills
- Walking with a family member or in a supervised buddy group
- Park and walk by getting dropped off a short distance away and walking the rest
- Using public transport, such as a bus, which is more eco-friendly than travelling by car

Examples of the benefits of Active Travel:


- Improve health
