Can I design and make a wooden photograph frame to gift to a grandparent?

Art and Design:

Can I use mixed media to sketch from photographs of grandparents or household objects?

Geography:

Where did grandparents go on holiday when they were young? Plot on maps.

Working Scientifically:

Pattern Seeking: Can I explore the use of the senses to identify flavours, smells and hidden objects using touch. **Research with secondary sources:** Looking at pictures taken in different time periods. What can we find out about how people lived differently to us?
