



Holiday	It comes from the words Holy Day because in the past Holidays were based around religious festivals.
Seaside	A place by the sea, usually with a beach and / or a holiday resort.
Beach	A pebbly or sandy shore between the sea and the land.
Coast	A part of the land next to the sea.
Shingle	A beach made of pebbles.
Promenade	A path next to the beach where people go for a long walk.
Carousel	A merry-go-round at a fair.
Amusement Arcade	An indoor area with lots of game machines
Souvenir	Something which you keep as a reminder of a place or an event.
Bathing Machine	They were used a long time ago so that people could change in private before going into the sea.
Punch and Judy show	A funny puppet show that was common at the seaside in Victorian times.
Entertainment	An activity that provides enjoyment
Promenade	A walk, usually along the seafront.
