settlers	A person who settles in a new area.
Danegeld	"Paying the Dane". King Etherlred paid the Vikings 4500kg of silver to go home but they kept returning and were paid 22,000 kg of silver in Danegeld altogether.
Exile	To be sent away.
Kingdom	An area ruled by a king.
Longship	A long, wooden, narrow boat used by the Vikings.
Pagans	A religion where many gods and goddesses are worshipped.
Pillaged	To violently steal something.
Raid	A surprise attack.
