Reception Baseline

Do you have a child starting reception class?

If so, your child will participate in the reception baseline assessment (RBA) within the first 6 weeks of starting reception. The purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point for a progress measure that will help parents understand how well schools support their pupils to progress between reception and year 6.

What is the RBA?


The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school.

Lunchtime/ Snack

At Livingstone, we follow the Monster Phonics scheme. We are excited to begin our Monster Phonics sessions.

Lessons are daily and are taught with the whole class. Children will take part in guided reading sessions using Monster Phonics books.

Easy And Accessible Phonics Support For Parents







- The children will bring home phonics books once they have been taught the first set of sounds.
- The children will be able to sound out and blend the sounds together to read the words.
- We ask that the children read their book at least 3 times at home in order to become confident and independent in their reading.
- When the children are writing, we expect them to write using their phonic knowledge. Therefore, words will be phonetically plausible and not necessarily spelt correctly e.g. 'tighm' for 'time' or 'dai' for 'day.'





Handwriting



When children are writing we encourage them to hold their pen/pencil correctly and it is important that they start their letters in the correct place.

We encourage the children to sit up straight at the table when they are writing.

Opportunities to complete activities at home linked to the story that week.


